Webster's Dictionary by Ben

Noah Webster was born October 16, 1758, in West Hartford, Connecticut, and educated at Yale University. He served in the American Revolution, studied law, and taught school. In 1783 he published a spelling book, known later as *Webster's Elementary Spelling Book* or the first part of his *A Grammatical Institute of the English Language*. The second part of the *Institute*, a grammar, was published in 1784, and the third part, a reader, in 1785. One purpose served by the *Institute* was to differentiate American English from British in terms of spelling, grammar, and pronunciation. A century later it was estimated that more than 60

million copies of the speller had been sold; in revised form it is still in print.

A dedicated member of the Federalist Party, Webster issued a pamphlet, *Sketches of American Policy*, in which he recommended adoption of the proposed U.S. Constitution. Settling briefly in New York City in 1793, he founded a daily newspaper, *The Minerva* and a semiweekly, *The Herald*, both in support of the Federalist Party. By 1803 he had settled in New Haven, Connecticut, and left journalism. During this period he wrote *A Brief History of Epidemic and*

Pestilential Disease, several works on politics, economics, and physical science; and his first small lexicographical work, *A Compendious Dictionary of the English Language*.

From 1812 to 1822 Webster lived in Amherst, Massachusetts, where he helped to found Amherst College. In 1825, having devoted more than 20 years to the study of the English language and having traveled in both England and France, Webster returned to New Haven to complete his monumental *American Dictionary of the English Language* (1828). It contained 12,000 more words and about 40,000 more definitions
